FIPRESCI-INDIA INTRODUCES ONLINE FILM APPRECIATION COURSE

As a part of its academic activities, Fipresci-India introduces an Online Film Appreciation Course with 18 weekend sessions on every Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning during June and July 2021. Total 70 participants from different parts of India, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka got themselves registered online for the Course. Many intending candidates could not be enrolled as the target of admission (only 40) crossed the limit. The Academic Council with Prof. N. Manu Chakravarty, Mr. Meghachandra Kongbam and Dr. Meenakshi Datta as Members and Mr. N. Vidyashankar as the Course Coordinator finalized the following schedule for the Course:

OBERHAUSEN INTL. FILM FESTIVAL



FIPRESCI Award in the 67th International Short Film Festival Oberhausen (1-10 May) went to: "{if your bait can sing the wild one will come} Like Shadows Through Leaves" by Lucy Davis (Singapore, Finland, 2021). Jury composed of Fritz De Jong (The Netherlands), Valentina Giraldo Sánchez (Colombia) and Elina Reitere (Latvia). Citation says the film "allows us to think of cinema as an aesthetic tool that questions, resists, and reimagines the relationships between culture and climate change".

BANGLADESH CELEBRATES FIFTY YEARS OF INDEPENDENCE



To celebrate the 50 Years of Independence of the People's Republic of Bangladesh (26 March 1971-2021), the Bangladesh Federation of Film Societies has curated a package of films for presenting to different Festivals worldwide. The package includes the acclaimed Feature Films "Shankhonaad" (2004)by Abu Saveed. "Swopnodanay" (On the Wings of Dreams, 2007, 88 mins) by Golam Rabbany Biplob, "Aha" (2007, 128 mins) by Enamul Karim Nirjhor, "Television" (2012, 106 mins) by Mostafa Sarwar Farooki, "Jalal's Story" (2014, 121 mins) by Abu Shahed Emon, "Halda" (2017, 150 mins) by Tauquir Ahmed, "Komola Rocket" (2018, 95 mins) by Noor Imran Mithu, "Made in Bangladesh" (2019, 95 mins) by Rubaiyat Hossain, and many others along with some selected documentaries.

MOSCOW INTL. FILM FESTIVAL



43rd **FIPRESCI** Award in the Moscow International Film Festival Russia (22-29 Apr) was given to the film "The Time of Indifference" by Leonardo Guerra Seràgnoli (Italy, 2020, 86 mins). FIPRESCI International Critics Jury was composed Alexandra Porshneva of (Kazakhstan), Darya Amialkovich (Belarus), Vasileios Kechagias (Greece), Karen Avetisyan (Armenia) and Nina Romodanovskaya (Russia). Jury Members and the international guests were physically invited to Moscow to experience the festival and the city.

NEPAL INTL. FILM FESTIVAL

The 4th Nepal International Film Festival (6-10 May) ended with declaration of prestigious Gautam Buddha Award for the Best International Feature Film, Mount Everest Award for the Best International Documentary and many other Awards given by the several International Jury. The Festival which was scheduled in Feb 2021 in Kathmandu could not be held due to pandemic. After reschedulina twice anticipation of organizing the Festival physically, finally it had to opt for going online due to resurgence of pandemic in Nepal. The Gautam Buddha Award which includes a trophy and a cash for 1500 USD went to the Indian Bengali feature film 'Dictionary' directed by Bratya Basu.



In their citation the Jury declared that the Award was given 'For the delicate depiction of a slice of the contemporary Indian society portrayed with warm humour and critique of the substitution of the cultural values'. Mt. Everest Award with a cash of 1000 USD went to the documentary "Return to the Lost Eden" (Switzerland) directed by Adriano Zecca. Don Quixote Award given by the International Federation of Film Societies went to the feature film "In My Dream" (Turkey) directed by Murat Ceri. Award for the Best National Feature Film (cash 100,000 NPR) went to "Ama Khando" (Nepal) directed by Dhondup Tsering and for the Best National Short Film (cash 50,000 NPR) went to "A Scarecrow" (Nepal) directed by Rajesh Prasad Khatri.

ASOKA HANDAGAMA'S NEXT FILM




Ace filmmaker Asoka Handagama of Sri Lanka coming up with another masterpiece titled "The Dawning of the Day" (Alborada). Work-inprogress of the film reveals it as an intoxicating visual poetry exposed rhythmically signifying the magic realism of Latin America blended with the Indo-Ceylonese cultural reality. Shooting of the film was completed during the pandemic. The film is a fictionalized account of the famous Chilean poet and activist Pablo Neruda's time in Sri Lanka from 1929 to 1931 under the British Raj as an Ambassador – His memoires from his time in Ceylon include a harrowing confession to raping a low-caste untouchable Tamil woman, tasked with cleaning his outhouse each dawn. Intense narrative, incredible cinematography, astounding sound, proficient editing outstanding performance mounted it as a brilliant film to keep continuation with Handagama's earlier works like "Asandhimitta" (2019), "Let Her Cry" (2016), "A Letter of Fire" (2005), "Flying With One Wing" (2002) and others.

SOUTH ASIAN SHORT FILM FESTIVAL



Call for Entries for the 4th South Asian Short Film Festival ends on 30 June. Short Fiction (max 40 mins) and Documentary (max 60 mins) made after 1 Jan 2018 are eligible. It's a competitive Festival with several cash awards like Satyajit Ray Golden Award for the Best Documentary, Ritwik Ghatak Golden Award for the Best Short Fiction and others.
